FINANCIAL

Is fiscal responsibility important to you as a citizen?
Should all areas of the city be considered when spending taxpayer dollars?

Should the city show restraint toward acquiring new debt until Project Jackson/Riverview Village demonstrate solvency?

Is the city transparent enough with the decisions that are made concerning how taxpayer dollars are being spent?

SOCIAL

Is the government of North Augusta representative and responsive to the broad population?

Do you think we have enough affordable housing for senior citizens and our diverse work force?

Do you believe we should have at least one park with access for children with disabilities or special needs?

COMMUNICATION

Do you think that the city should make a concentrated effort to better inform its citizens?

Should the city televise study sessions and council meetings with equipment that delivers clarity? (TV camera and speakers.)

Why doesn't the current administration deliver reports on the status (monthly or quarterly) to the citizens on projects that have a high profile?

Should the citizens be allowed to present their views at City Council meetings and not be harassed by a buzzer?

Why is financial information not delivered in a current manner (on-line check disbursements, year-to-date status) so the public can see how money is being spent?
Should City Council agendas be released earlier so that council and citizens can research topics instead of getting them the last possible minute?

Should contracts and documents that commit taxpayer monies be made available for viewing without a FOIA request?
